Policy on Injury to a Child: (Medical Emergencies)

A. Our staff is First Aid & CPR trained. A staff member/teacher will take immediate action to protect a child from further harm, and will notify the child's parent(s) by telephone when one of the following occurs:

- 1. A child is bitten and the skin is **broken**;
- 2. A child sustains a **head or facial injury** (above the shoulders)
- 3. A child falls from a height greater than the height of the child:
- 4. An injury requiring professional medical care occurs such as stitches

The staff member/teacher will direct others to comfort the child and apply **basic first aid** as permitted. The staff member/teacher will notify one of the following: The Director, the <u>Designee</u>, the Sponsor, or the Head Teacher.

B. The school will maintain on file a <u>written record</u> of **all incidents** resulting in an injury. Any injury requiring <u>professional medical care must be documented on a long form for the Director to review</u>. Either form requires the **signature** of a **staff member** and the **parent**. Parents may request a copy of the report. All information must be **written in ink in the classroom log book in detail** with the observations of any witnesses included. A staff member <u>must call the parent</u> to learn the extent of injury the child sustained and the treatment provided by a physician or hospital emergency room. <u>The date & time of the phone call shall be recorded in the classroom log with this information</u>. The record shall be completed as soon as possible & include:

- The name of the injured child;
- The date, time and location of the incident:
- The name & address of the center:
- The name & date of the person completing the report
- A written description of the incident; & the type of injury
- The names of witnesses to the incident
- The follow up action taken:
 - o EMS called?
 - o Physician consulted?
 - o Emergency Room Treatment?
 - Parent called after treatment by the Teacher or Director?

Our school shall distribute a copy of this policy to the parent of each child enrolled, securing a signature from each parent attesting to the receipt of this policy. *Manual of Requirements* p72-73

Medical Emergencies: Call 911

The following situations are considered a medical emergency:

- The child or adult has difficulty breathing or is unable to speak
- The child or adult has poor skin color or lips look blue, purple or gray
- The child or adult is unconscious
- The child or adult is having seizures
- The child or adult has uncontrolled bleeding
- The child or adult had a severe choking episode
- The child or adult has difficulty walking, is confused, complains of a headache & vomiting.
