# **Policy on Injury to a Child**: (Medical Emergencies)

Our staff is First Aid and CPR trained. A staff member/teacher will take immediate action to protect a child from further harm, and will notify the child's parent(s) by telephone when one of the following occurs:

- A child is bitten and the skin is broken;
- A child sustains a head or facial injury (above the shoulders)
- A child falls from a height greater than the height of the child;
- An injury requiring professional medical care occurs; \*

The staff member/teacher will comfort the child and apply basic first aid as permitted and direct someone to **call** the parent and **notify** the Director/Designee. \*An injury resulting in a child visiting the emergency room or being admitted to the hospital, or a call to 911 with EMS transportation care must be reported to the Office of Licensing by the next working day verbally & with a written injury report.

### **Documentation:**

The **staff** member/teacher must complete and <u>sign</u> the **required** accident/injury report for **any** injury and obtain the signature of the **Director**/Designee and **Parent**. A photocopy of the report must be placed in the <u>office communication folder by the next working day</u>. Copies are maintained in the office. Upon request of the child's parent, the center shall provide a copy of the accident/injury report by the end of the next operating day.

A brief description of the injury must be written in ink in the classroom log book including: date, time, location & treatment, witnesses, method of notification & follow-up action.

# Follow-Up:

The staff member completing the accident/injury report must call the parent to learn the extent of an injury and the treatment received at a doctor's office, emergency room, or a hospital stay in order to complete the accident/injury report.

# Medical Emergencies - Call 911 in the following situations:

- A child or adult has difficulty breathing or is unable to speak and/or
- The child or adult has poor skin color or lips are blue, purple or grey;
- A child or adult is unconscious or experiencing seizures;
- The child or adult has uncontrolled bleeding;
- A child or adult has had a severe choking episode;
- The child or adult has difficulty walking, is confused, complains of severe headache & is vomiting;
- If it is necessary to administer an EpiPen to a child or adult having a severe allergic reaction.

A copy of this policy shall be distributed to the parent of each child enrolled, securing a signature from the parent attesting to the receipt of the policy (Manual of Requirements, p.73).
